
Virtual Bible Study Wednesdays at 5:00pm via Zoom

Ministry as Mothering

True story: One winter Sunday morning my seminary colleague was invited to preach in a

small country church when the pastor was ill. He noticed a piece of cardboard taped over a broken sanctuary window. Pointing to it, he began his sermon apologetically. "I'm a lot like that cardboard," he said. "I may be able to fill a hole, but I doubt the much light will get through." At the end of the service, one of the older members said to him, "Reverend, you don't need to apologize. You're a real pane!"

I think about that story as I begin a ministry between your previous interim and your forthcoming settled pastor. It will not be for me to lead you through interim tasks. Pastor Jim did that. It will not be for me to help you dream dreams, see visions and build for the future. Your new minister will do that. What is my role? Will I be a pane or – God forbid! - a pain?

The Welsh poet, Waldo Williams, once described his mother:

She was anxious for many at evening, and the weary knew the entrance to her court. She would rejoice with the joyful, sense the pain, join the feast. In the ocean of her heart there was a cherishing. (Angharad)

This seems like an apt description of ministry. I will work with you and learn from you. I will join your talented staff as we get to know each other better and learn to support each other's growth. I will engage with you weekly on a spiritual journey through these perilous times. We will share sacred moments together, sometimes with tears, sometimes with laughter, and sometimes in awe-struck silence. We will share practical moments too, when we need to pull together and do what needs to be done. To the best of my ability, I will cherish you.

Pastor Budd describes himself as a "Christ-centered universalist." He will join Peace in February as a "Bridge Minister" – a role he will explain in his first two sermons. He comes from Sarasota, FL, but served Congregational, Unitarian Universalist, and UCC churches in six states before he "retired".

On Sunday, January 29th, 66 faithful and concerned congregation members came to our Annual congregational meeting to discuss and approve of our 2023 budget. Thanks to Nathan and Charlotte for managing a way to allow for 16 people to Zoom into the meeting and participate in the lively discussion. Lively, it was. Members were very engaged in discussing the Vision statement proposed by the Council. Words matter. After all was said and done, here is the new, approved Vision statement:

"Our vision is to be an accessible, open, and affirming community, growing in Christian faith, committed to peace and justice, and building the beloved community. We strive to respect and value all of creation, and the diversity of people's sexual orientation, gender expression and identity, class, race, culture, age, and physical and mental abilities."

The meeting turned to our 2023 budget which was presented with a large deficit for the next year. I can't offer enough thanks for the patience and questions as folks engaged thoughtfully and civilly in the discussion. We had not anticipated the drop in pledges this year. With hope and faith, the budget was approved as presented. Going forward there will be much more discussion about how we will raise funds to make up for this deficit. It will be reviewed on a regular basis and the congregation will be informed about our progress.

By now you all should have received the letter of appeal to you to help us as we envision Peace Church with a new settled pastor. In order to support the mission of Peace Church and continue with our mission and the love we have for each other, we asked you all to dig deep and consider how you can help. Together we can make this happen.


